## Within the framework of events dedicated to the 60th anniversary of the first manned flight into space and decades of science

At the Department of Space Engineering and Technology of the Faculty of Physics and Technology of the L.N. Gumilyov Eurasian National University, an event dedicated to the «60th anniversary of the first manned space flight» was organized. As part of the events held, candidate of technical sciences, doctor PhD, associate professor of the Department of Space Engineering and Technology Akhmetov Kairat Telektesovich spent a curatorial hour with 1st year undergraduates. The head of the department, Yergaliev D.S., responsible for educational and methodological work, Moldamurat Kh., Senior curator Anuar G.A., took part in the round table dedicated to the 60th anniversary of the first manned space flight. Master students prepared video recordings and presentation materials. The curatorial hour passed at the proper level.

April 12 is the day of the conquest of space by humanity. Therefore, since 1968, the International Aviation Federation has approved this day as the World Day of Aviation and Astronautics. And the General Assembly of the United Nations has declared the international day of manned space flight. Cosmonaut training began in the former USSR in 1960, and in the United States in 1959 and 1962. From the first cosmonaut Yuri Gagarin (1961), more than four hundred people flew into space. Among them are Kazakh cosmonauts Tokhtar Aubakirov, Talgat Musabayev, Aydin Aimbetov.

Exactly 60 years ago, humanity first conquered space. April 12 – Yuri Gagarin spent 1 hour 48 minutes in space on the «Vostok» motor ship, which departed from the Baikonur cosmodrome, and returned to earth. Since then, we have come to the period when many rockets were launched and a tourist trip was organized.

Today Kazakhstan has become one of the world's leading states in space exploration. The launch of KazSat satellites carries out digital broadcasting, telecom operators and weather forecasting.
